J.A.M. One-Day Camp Spring Break March 16th



We used sports and competition to inspire the students physically, mentally, and spiritually to appreciate the great power to live a passionate and purposeful life. First, the physical challenges included a series of athletic relay races and sports performance drills. Second, mental challenges included communication and leadership team events that helped demonstrate the power and responsibility each student has to work for the success of their team. Third, the spiritual challenges that come through mini-J.A.M. session talks where students are reminded to appreciate the Power of their Presence: their life is valuable because they are made in God's image and are a unique creation; the Power of their Position/Purpose: God has designed and placed them here for a unique purpose with talents and skills. 


There were four teams as shown to the right. Seven countries were represented Spain, Jamaica, Zambia, Haiti, France, Cuba, and the U.S.
